NATURE DISCOVERY CAMPS - AGES 4-8

BUDS - AGES 4 - 6

Young campers will use their senses to explore the great outdoors and discover different plants and animals along the way. Fun-filled activities include trail walks, nature games, crafts, stories, and animal encounters. Class limit is 30 children.

TADPOLES - AGES 7-8

Older campers will investigate their natural surroundings and learn to understand the relationships of plants and wildlife to the ecosystem. Each camp lets your child be a real explorer, using science in fun ways to better understand the natural world! Environmental games, animal encounters, nature crafts, and other nature activities help to illustrate and reinforce the ecological concepts covered in daily adventures. Class limit is 30 children.

Buds & Tadpoles will be in separate learning groups on the same day and time. Spaces are limited.

Pollinator Powers Tuesday, June 13, 10:00 -11:30 AM

Learn about the importance of pollinators like bats, bees, and butterflies while we play a game, make a craft, and visit pollinators in the Butterfly House!

Animal Sounds Wednesday, June 21, 10:00 – 11:30 AM

There are many different and interesting reason animals communicate; whether it is to find mates, warn of danger, or mark territory. You will learn the songs and calls of birds, insects, frogs, and mammals. Outside you will get to howl like a wolf, hoot like an owl and make many other animal sounds yourself.



Turtle Time Thursday, June 29, 10:00 – 11:30 AM

Get to know the turtles at Sarett, have turtle races, and learn about these awesome animals who carry their homes.

Spinning Spiders Wednesday, July 5, 10:00 - 11:30 AM

Learn how spiders spin, jump, dance, dig, and dive in this creepy crawly class!

Milkweed Village Thursday, July 13, 10:00 – 11:30 AM

Monarch butterflies are not the only animals that use milkweed. Discover some of the other animals that use milkweed too and how these animals interact with each other. We will be hiking to the milkweed field so be prepared with water and a hat.

Nature CSI Wednesday, June 14, 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM

Can you solve the case? Learn about animal tracks and signs as well as other forensic evidence to uncover clues at a variety of nature "crime scenes" to figure out whodunnit!



Gardening Tuesday, June 20 9:30 AM - 1:00 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM and (Optional) Wednesday, August 9, 9:30 - Noon

Have you ever wanted to grow your own fruits and vegetables? Or provide food and shelter for native pollinators? Join us in learning how to plant and tend a garden! Kids will learn the basics of plant-care and be sent home with materials to start their own garden. This is a two part class: the first class participants will build and sow a garden bed outside of the nature center. At the end of the summer, kids are invited back to an optional second class where they may collect produce from the garden. Participants are welcome to visit their garden bed throughout the summer to help weed and water.



Rock Hunting Thursday, June 22, 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM

Learn about the different types of rocks and fossils we can find in Michigan and then travel to Pilgrim Haven Natural Area for some of the best rock hunting in southwest Michigan.

Outdoor Skills Wednesday and Thursday, July 5 & 6, 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM \$60 M/ \$80 NM



Wilderness survival is a practical skill set for outdoor enthusiasts. Students will learn basic survival techniques including shelter, fire, water, and food as well as bushcraft skills applicable to non-survival scenarios.

Drawing: Animals Thursday, July 20 9:30 AM - 2:00 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM






Fishy Fun Tuesday, July 25, 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM

canoe. Please bring a sack lunch and a fishing pole if you have one.




Zoo Day Thursday, July 27, 8:30 AM – 3:30 PM \$30 M/ \$40 NM

NATURE QUEST

Nature Quest is a fantasy adventure – nature science camp in which participants will learn ecological and stewardship practices through a fantastical lens. Over the course of four days, members of nature quest will build their characters, go on nature hikes, and use teamwork to problem solve imagined, ecologically based quandaries. The final day will be an off-site field trip to an as yet determined location. Transportation from Sarett will be provided. Nature Quest is a full day outdoor camp. Participants will need to bring lunch, sturdy shoes, lots of water, insect repellent and sun protection.

WATER ADVENTURES - AGES 10+



Let's have fun exploring the area's waterways and learning how to kayak or canoe! Paddlers should always dress as if they are going to get wet, especially footwear. PFD's (life vests) will be the provided and must be worn the entire time we are on the water. Paddling takes a lot of energy, so bring a good lunch, snacks, and a lot of water. Also wear a hat for sunshade, sunglasses, bug repellent, and sunscreen.

Beginning Kayaking

Thursday, June 15, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM Friday, June 16, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM \$30 Member/ \$40 Nonmember

On the first day you will learn all the basic skills of kayaking: how to use the paddle, how to enter and exit the kayak and how to be safe. We will practice our skills by playing games and exploring North Lake near Grande Mere State Park. You will learn about some of the plants and animals that live there. On the second day we will paddle a 2-hour stretch of the St. Joseph River between St. Patrick's County Park and Niles. We always see many turtles, some herons and usually an eagle or two.

Introduction to Canoeing

Tuesday, July 18, 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM \$30 Member/ \$40 Nonmember



Canoes are embedded within Michigan's history and culture. Students will learn the basics of canoeing in this hands-on course. Proper paddling techniques, steering, and canoe safety will be covered.

Kayak the Paw Paw River

Friday, July 28, 10:00 AM – 1:30 PM \$20 Member/ \$25 Nonmember

Use your paddling skills to enjoy a stretch of the scenic, meandering Paw Paw River. We will complete the section from County Line Road to the Paw Paw River County Park in Watervliet. Completing a Sarett Nature Center class is a prerequisite for doing this trip.

Beginning Kayaking

Thursday, July 6, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM Friday, July 7, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM \$30 Member/ \$40 Nonmember

- **Step 5:** Once all of your choices are in the cart, click on the cart to pay for classes.

 - Payment


Before the Day of Camp...

It is important to fill out the Camp Release Forms **BEFORE** the day of camp. By doing this it will allow a quick check-in the day of camp.

Camp release forms may be found at www.sarett.org/summer-camp. This is a <u>fillable</u> <u>pdf</u>; allowing you to fill in the information right on the form without printing it out.

Here's some help:

- 1. Download the pdf file.
- 2. Fill in the blue spaces depending on the number of campers you have. (You only have to fill out one of these forms for all your campers.)
- 3. Ignore the signature line. Your typed name below it is fine.
- 4. SAVE your document!
- 5. Send your document to sarett@sarett.org as an attachment. Most likely the document will be found in your downloads folder unless you saved it to a different place.
- 6. Watch your email for a confirmation from Sarett.
- 7.On the day of your camp, all you will need to do is check-in and get your camper's nametag.
